"The severest loss sustained by the regiment was at the battle of New Berne in Feb., 1864, when it lost 91 in killed, wounded and missing. During this battle, Cos. D, E and G defended the bridge on the Neuse river against three successive attacks of the enemy, but were finally forced to retire when the enemy was reinforced, after 4 hours of hard fighting. The 132nd is credited with saving New Berne from capture on this occasion. Lieut. Arnold Zenette, the only commissioned officer killed, fell in this action."

90 names here--- 4 officers and 86 enlisted men. This nearly tallies exactly with Colonel Claassen's detailed report in the Official Records 1, Volume 33, p. 67. The number is also given as 1 officer and 79 enlisted men missing in the return of casualties on page 69.

At least 60-67 enlisted men died in Confederate hands and 2 more died at Annapolis a short time after release.

There were 7 enlisted survivors and 2 of them appear not to have gone to Andersonville. This makes a total of around 70 men who went into captivity. The death rate is certainly close to 90%, perhaps higher. [ Another 39 captives from the 99<sup>th</sup> New York would also die about a rate of 85%, along with 19-24 men from the 3<sup>rd</sup> NY Artillery, Battery K. at a rate over 68% ]

6 men were killed in action and Colonel Claassen tallies 5.

My count here is 8 wounded; Claassen finds 6 which is accurate because one man was wounded and captured and another seems to have been left on the field.

In all, this is an extremely accurate accounting of casualties, however shocking is the death rate of the prisoners.

By March 5, approximately five weeks after capture, the dying began at Belle Island prison, Richmond. They appear to have spent about a month to six weeks in Richmond. At some point they are headed south and are at Columbus, GA, where seven men die. [See page 19 in the pension file under David Simpson, Co. H, 99<sup>th</sup> NY Infantry at <a href="www.fold3.com">www.fold3.com</a>] William Freeland dies at Cahaba, AL, on March 17. Perhaps three other men, only vaguely noted as "died in a Confederate prison, no date," are with him?

By April 11, the dying at Richmond is nearly over. Some men must arrive at Andersonville by March 22 or earlier. Five men die there between March 22 and April 3. After April 11, until October 16, over 41 men will die at Andersonville. 10 in April; 7 in May; 5 in June; 8 in July; 6 in August; 3 in September and October. One man dies in Charleston on October 11. There are not many left by the time the exchange ship arrives sometime in December---possibly late November. About 58% of them died at Andersonville alone. Two more will die as paroled prisoners at Hospital #1 in Annapolis, MD----Jasper Price lasting until January 8, 1865.

Survivors William Bath, Pius Baumann, Abram Dalton seem to have survived Salisbury prison as well. Baumann and Charles Wagemuns live into the 1920's, the latter man into his late eighties.
