

#### NATIONAL GUARD.

The National Guard of the State consists of a field hospital, two companies of signal corps, one regiment of engineers' one squadron of cavalry of three troops, one squadron of two troops, two separate troops of cavalry, four batteries of light artillery, one regiment of coast artillery, thirteen regiments, four battalions and forty-eight separate companies of infantry; the separate companies constituting the 1st, 2d and 10th regiments, 1st, 2nd and 3d battalions.

The National Guard is commanded, under the orders of the Governor, by a Major-General, and is divided into four brigades, each commanded by a Brigadier-General.

The Field Hospital; 1st and 2d Companies. Signal Corps; 22d Regiment Engineers; Squadrons A and C, and Troops B and D, Cavalry; the 1st. 2d, 3d and 6th Batteries, Light Artillery, and the 13th Regiment, Coast Artillery, are attached to the Headquarters of the National Guard and under the direct orders of the Major-General.

Headquarters are located at Albany, at the Capitol, with an office in New York City, at 280 Broadway.

This regiment was organized in April, 1861; it entered the United States service May 28, 1862, for three months, and was mustered out September 5, 1862, having been stationed at Washington, D. C., and later forming part of the garrison at Harper's Ferry, Va. June 18, 1863, it was again mustered in the service of the United States for thirty days, and was mustered out July 24, 1863. In 1867 the regiment took up rifle practice as part of its drill, and in 1871 it established for itself a rifle range and system of practice which was in 1873 adopted by the National Rifle Association. Co. G was disbanded March-22, 1878, and new Co. G organized April 30, 1879. Co. F was disbanded October 10, 1890, and new Co. F organized January 8, 1891. Co. I was disbanded October 10, 1890, and new Co. I organized October 6, 1892. May 7, 1898, it was authorized to be temporarily consolidated into eight companies, and four companies of the 13th Regiment were attached to it, preparatory to entry into the United States service, in which it was mustered on May 24, 1898, a steb 22d Regiment Infantry, N. Y. Vols., and it was mustered out November 23, 1898. February 20, 1902, the regiment was constituted a regiment of engineers and designated 22d Regiment Engineers.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

November 27, 1896, Squadron A was divided into three troops, to be known as Troops 1, 2 and 3. The squadron was on duty at the strike at Croton Dam, April, 1900. One troop (Troop A), made up of members of the three troops of the squadron, was in United States service from May 20, 1898, to November 28, 1898.

The squadron has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors engraved as follows:

This regiment was organized July 5, 1847; there were changes in the organization a few years later, again in April, 1859, and in 1860. It was disbanded May 7, 1898, except one battalion of four companies, which had volunteered to enter the United States service; and authority was given to reorganize it May 15, 1898. November 28, 1898, such portion of the regiment as had been organized was disbanded, and authority was given to re-establish the regiment, the battalion which was in the United States service forming the nucleus of the new organization. Companies L and M were organized March 11, 1899; February 8, 1900, it was constituted a regiment of heavy artillery and designated 13th Regiment of Heavy Artillery of the National Guard, New York. This designation was changed to coast artillery, Sept. 1, 1906. The regiment was in the service of the United States for three months from April 23, 1861, and was mustered out August 6, 1861; again from May 28 to September 12, 1862, and for the third time from June 20 to July 20, 1863, for thirty days; it was in the State service during the Draft riots in July and August, 1863; the Orange riots, July 12, 1871; the Railroad riots, July, 1877; the Switchmen's strike at Buffalo, August, 1892; the Quarantine disturbances at Fire Island, September, 1892, and the Motormen's strike at Brooklyn, January, 1895. The battalion which volunteered to enter the United States service as part of the 22d Regiment, New York Volunteer Infantry, in the war with Spain, was mustered into such service May 24,

The regiment has received authority to place a silver ring on the lance of its National Color engraved as follows: Spanish-American War, 1898.

April 27, 1898, the Governor directed the commanding officer of the Third Brigade to organize two regiments of such portions of his command as desired to volunteer for service in the United States Volunteer Army. The Second Regiment was composed of the 6th, 7th, 9th, 12th, 18th, 21st, 22d, 31st, 32d, 36th, 37th and 46th Separate Companies, the companies being designated as A. B, I, C, K, D, L, G, M, E, F and H, respectively. It entered the service of the United States, May 16 and 17, 1898, and was mustered out of such service: Companies A, B, C and D on Oct. 25, Co. M on Oct. 26, Co. L. on Oct. 27, Co. I on Oct. 28, Co. K on Oct. 29, Cos. E and F on Oct. 31, Cos. G and H on Nov. 1, and the field and staff on Oct. 31, 1898. On its re-entry into the State service it was, on Nov. 19, 1898, continued as a twelve-company regiment, composed as in the volunteer service as stated above. The 31st Separate Company was detached from this regiment on Nov. 9, 1900, and assigned to the 4th Battalion. The 19th Separate Company was organized Nov. 9, 1900, at Gloversville, N. Y., and assigned to this regiment as Co. G.

Companies A, B, C and D were organized during the excitement created by the firing of British at American vessels off Sandy Hook in April, 1806, as the first, second, third and fourth companies, and June 25th they were officially recognized by the State as part of the uniformed militia of the State, and attached to the battalion of artillery commanded by Major Andrew Sitcher. April 5, 1807, the battalion, in the organization of the 3d Regt. of New York Artillery, became its 2d Battalion. When war with England became imminent in 1807, these four companies, with other volunteers, were temporarily organized as a regiment, commanded by Colonel Peter Curtenius, and remained thus detached until April 20, 1809. In 1812 the 3d became the 11th Regt. of Artillery, the four companies remaining the 2d Battalion. Aug. 25, 1824, the battalion was named "Battalion of National Guards" (its distinctive name until, in 1862, the Legislature appropriated it for the uniformed militia), and in December, 1824, the fifth company was organized and Captain Stevens' company of the 11th New York Artillery transferred to it as the sixth company. In January, 1825, the battalion was transferred to the 2d New York Artillery. Oct. 1, 1825, the battalion was detached and organized as a separate and independent battalion, and during the month the seventh company was organized. May 4, 1826, the organization of the eighth company was completed, and May 6th the battalion was organized into a regiment, the 27th Artillery. April 17, 1838, a troop of cavalry was admitted to the regiment, which, in 1861, became the ninth company. In 1843 the State furnished the regiment with arms, it having heretofore provided them itself. July 27th the designation of the regiment was changed to 7th Regt. In April, 1849, an engineer corps was organized, which in 1861, became the tenth company. The regiment was frequently ordered to hold itself ready for service, and did active service for the United States, the State and New York city, as follows: In United States service from Sept. 15 to Dec. 15, 1812; from Sept. 2 to Dec. 2, 1814; from April 19 to June 3, 1861; from May 26 to Dec. 5, 1862; from June 17 to July 21, 1863. In support of State or municipal authority: Execution of James Reynolds, Nov. 19, 1825; at the Election riots, April 10, 1834; Abolition riot, July 11 to 12, 1834; Great conflagration in New York city, Dec. 17, 1835; Stevedore riot, Feb. 24, 1836; Flour riots, Feb. 6 and March 6, 1837; Anti-rent war, Dec. 9 to 10, 1839; Croton water riot, April 22 to 23, 1840; fire in New York city, July 19 to 21, 1845; Astor Place riot, May 10, 12 and 14, 1849; Police riot, June 16, 1857; Dead Rabbit riot, July 5, 1857; Quarantine war, Jan. 3, 1859; preserving order at camp of Spinola Brigade, Sept. 12 to 19, 1862; Draft riots, July, 1863; Orange riots, July, 1871; Labor riots, July, 1877; Motormen's strike, Brooklyn, January, 1895; and at strike, Croton Dam, April, 1900.

The 10th Regiment was organized on December 29, 1860, by General Orders No. 50, A. G. O., of that year. Captain Ira W. Ainsworth's Company of the 29th Regiment being detached from that regiment and assigned to the 10th as the neucleus of the new regiment; Captain Ainsworth subsequently becoming the first colonel of the 10th Regiment with rank from May 27, 1862.

On May 17, 1881, the 10th Regiment, with the exception of Companies A, B, D and K was disbanded and these companies retained in the service as the 10th Separate Battalion. On October 1, 1884, the designation of Company K was changed to C.

April 28, 1898, the 1st Regiment was organized preparatory to entry in United States service and Companies A, B, C and D of the 10th Battalion became Companies A, B, C and D of the 1st Regiment. On the disbandment of this regiment on March 15, 1899, these companies resumed their former designations in the 10th Battalion.

The Battalion organization of the 10th Battalion was disbanded on May 1, 1905, and Companies A, B, C and D constituted separate companies, designated respectively, as the 26th, 35th, 38th and 45th Separate Companies. On the same date the 10th Regiment, composed of separate companies was reorganized and its headquarters established at Albany, and the 26th, 35th, 38th and 45th Separate Companies attached to it as Companies A, B, C and D, respectively. In addition the 16th, 23d, 4th, 11th, 17th, 15th and 14th Separate Companies were assigned to the regiment and designated respectively as E, F, G, H, I, K, and M.

The 10th Regiment was mustered in the service of the United States as the 177th New York Volunteers, November 21, 1862, and was mustered out September 10, 1863. Companies A, B, C, D, K and M were mustered in the United States service as Companies A, B, C, D, K and M, 1st New York Volunteer Infantry, May 20, 1898, and were mustered out February 20, 1899. The 10th Regiment was on duty in aid of the civil authorities in the Helderbergs in 1865, during the Anti-Rent War; during the Railway Strike at West Albany in 1877; the 10th Battalion at Buffalo during the Switchmen's Strike in 1892; at Albany during the Street Railway Strike in 1901; and a portion of the 10th Regiment at Coeymans during a strike in May, 1906.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

This regiment was organized as the 11th Regt. by a general order dated June 21, 1847, and was of eight companies, viz.: Light Guard of 106th Regt.; Bensen Guard, of 125th Regt.; Independence Guard, of 264th Regt.; Italian Guard, of 252d Regt.; Monroe Blues, of 235th Regt.; Tompkins Blues, of 51st Regt.; Independent Tompkins Blues, of 222d Regt., and LaFayette Fusiliers, of 85th Regt. By a general order dated July 27, 1847, the designation of the regiment was changed to the 12th. A new company, under command of Captain Henry Johnson, was organized and attached to the regiment, April 25, 1849. Co. H of the 3d Regt. was transferred to the 12th Regt., April 25, 1849. Co. D was consolidated with Co. C, June 5, 1849. A new company, under Captain Adolphus I. Johnson, was organized April 15, 1850. Co. L was transferred to the 11th Regt., May 3, 1858. On March 16, 1859, Cos. A and C, B and H, and G and E were consolidated, and the consolidated companies, with Co. D, transferred to the 10th Regt. On June 29, 1859, these transferred companies were disbanded. On Nov. 16, 1859, five companies (A, B, C, D and G) were organized in the Twenty-second Regimental District. On Nov. 22, 1859, Co. E was organized and an election ordered for field officers of the 22d Regt. These companies were composed principally of former members of the old 12th Regt. The designation of the 22d Regt. was changed Dec. 19, 1859, to 12th Regt. Co. H. was organized Jan. 28, 1860, and Co. F, Feb. 2, 1860. Co. C was consolidated with Co. E, March 21, 1861. and Co. K was organized May 8, 1861. Co. I, 23d Regt., was transferred to 12th Regt. as Co. I, April 2, 1861. New Co. C was organized Dec. 31,1861. Co. K was disbanded Feb. 12, 1862, and new Co. K organized Sept. 22, 1862. Co. C was consolidated with Co. H, Jan. 12, 1876. Co. I was consolidated with Co. G. Jan. 12, 1876. New Co. I was organized Feb. 21, 1876. Co. D was consolidated with Co. E. March 11, 1876. New Co. D was organized July 16, 1884, and new Co. C was organized June 3, 1885. The regiment performed duty during the Astor Place riots in 1849. April 21, 1861, the regiment entered the United States service for three months; July 12, took part in a skirmish near Martinsburgh, and July 15, near Bunkerhill, W. Va.; Aug. 5, 1861, it was mustered out of service at New York city. May 27, 1862, the regiment again entered the United States service for three months, during which they were engaged in the defense of Harper's Ferry, and were present at the surrender, although their services expired Aug. 27, 1862, having volunteered to remain in service until Oct. 15, 1862; Sept. 16 the regiment was paroled; Oct. 8 it was mustered out, and Jan. 11, 1863, declared exchanged. June 20, 1863, the regiment re-entered the service of the United States for thirty days, serving in Pennsylvania and Maryland, and in suppressing the Draft riots at New York city; it was mustered out by companies between July 20 and 25, but remained in the service of the State until September, 1863. The regiment was on duty during the Orange riots in July, 1871; during the Railroad riots in July, 1877; during the Switchmen's strike at Buffalo, in August, 1892, and at Brooklyn during the Motormen's strike in January, 1895. April 28, 1898, the regiment was authorized to be organized as a twelve-company regiment to enter the United States service, in which it was mustered as the 12th Regt. Inf., N. Y. Vols., May 13, 1898, and mustered out April 20, 1899; Companies L and M were disbanded April 24, 1899.

This regiment was organized in 1847. It entered the service of the United States for three years in May, June and July, 1861; June 1, 1864, those entitled to discharge were mustered out, and the re-enlisted men and recruits transferred to the 5th New York Volunteers. During this service the regiment was also known as the 84th New York Volunteers. April 28, 1898, it was authorized to be organized as a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to entering the service of the United States, in which service it was mustered May 13, 1898; it was mustered out of such service Oct. 27, 1898. Dec. 6th, the regiment was continued as a regiment of the National Guard composed of twelve companies.

The regiment was organized in 1848. Cos. K and I were disbanded, the latter in 1875. A new Co. I was organized in 1879, and Co. E was consolidated with Co. H the same year. In 1880 Co. B was consolidated with Co. A, and Troop L, Cavalry, Eighth Division, was reorganized as a company of infantry and attached to the regiment as Co. E. In 1881 Cos. D and E were disbanded. A new Co. B and a new Co. D were organized in 1885. It entered the service of the United States June 19, 1863, and was mustered out July 30, 1863. The 69th Regiment was organized October 12, 1851. In 1858 it was reorganized as an artillery regiment, doing duty as infantry. It was mustered in the United States service May 9, 1861, at Washington, D. C., to serve three months, and mustered out August 3, 1861, during which service it took part in actions at Blackburn's Ford and Bull Run. In August, 1861, about 800 men of this regiment joined the 69th N. Y. Vols., to serve three years. The regiment was again recruited and re-entered the service of the United States May 26, 1862, to serve three months; it was mustered out of service September 3, 1862. On the return from this service again the major part of the regiment entered the service of the United States for three years as the 69th National Guard Artillery, or 182d N. Y. Vols. The regiment having been reorganized, was mustered in the service of the United States for thirty days, from June 25 to July 25, 1863. July 6, 1864, it was again mustered in the United States service for three months, and mustered out October 6, 1864. The regiment has rendered the State service during the Quarantine riots in 1858; the Draft riots, 1863, and the Quarantine disturbances in 1832. It was reduced December 6, 1833, to a battalion of five companies, A, C, D, I and K. The battalion was on duty at Brooklyn during the Motormen's strike in January, 1895. New companies were organized for the battalion as follows: Co. B, June 5, 1894; Co. G, June 10, 1895; Co. E, June 11, 1895, and Co. F, September 7, 1900. The battal on was reconstituted a regiment September 4, 1895. April 28, 1898, the regiment received authority to organize as a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to its entry in the United States service, in which service it was mustered May 19, 1898, as the 69th Regiment, N. Y. Vol. Inf., and mustered out January 31, 1893. Companies L and M were disbanded April 12, 1899; Co. F, February 8, 1900, and Co. B, March 5, 1900. Co. F was reorganized and mustered in May 31, 1900. New Co. B was organized Jan. 4, 1906.

The regiment has received authority to place a silver ring on the lance of its National Color, engraved as follows: Spanish-American war, 1898.

The regiment was organized in August, 1852. The American Rifles, a battalion of four companies, formed the nucleus of the regiment. September 21, 1870, the 37th Regt. was consolidated with the 71st Regt., Cos. E, D, H, A, G, K and B of the 37th Regt. being consolidated with Cos. A, C, D, E, F, G and K of the 71st Regt., respectively. In 1861 it entered the United States service for three months, from April 21 to July 30; in 1862 it re-entered the same service, May 29, for three months, at the expiration of which it volunteered to remain, and remained until September 1; in 1863 it was mustered in the United States service for thirty days, and served from June 17 to July 22. April 28, 1898, it received authority to organize as a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to its entry into the United States service, in which it was mustered May 10, 1898, as the 71st Regt., N. Y. Vol. Infantry, and mustered out November 15, 1898. December 8, 1898, it was reorganized as a National Guard regiment, composed of ten companies, Cos. L and M being disbanded.

In June, 18/54, the organization of the regiment commenced, Co. D of the 65th Regiment forming the nucleus. Co. B was organized in August, and Companies C and E in September, 1851; Co. A was formed in May, 18/5; and these five companies constituted the regiment until "bruary, 1853, when two companies, one of cavitry (R) and one of rifles (L), were organized and attached to it. In 1860 Companies F, G, H and I were organized, and the designation of Co. L was in 1865 changed to Co. K. Co. R was disbanded in 1865, Co. H in 1868; Co. I was consolidated with Co. B in 1870, and in 1832 Companies E and K were disbanded. Co. E was reorganized in 1886, and Co. H in 1891. New Co. I was organized Jan. 4, 1906. In May, 1861, nearly the whole of Companies B, C, D and F joined and f rmed four companies of the 21st N. Y. Vols. June 19, 1863, the regiment was mustered in the service of the United States for thirty days, and mustered out August 3, 1863; it was remustered in the United States service November 16, 1863. for thirty days, and mustered out December 16, 1863. During the War of the Rebellion the regiment furnished to the country nearly 300 officers and over 1,000 men, who received their first military instruction while members of it.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors engraved as follows:

On the National Color.-Gettysburg Campaign, 18.3; Buffalo, November and December, 1863.

On the State Color .- Draft riots, 1863; Negro riot, 1864; Fenian invasion of Canada, 866; Hornellsville, 1877; Baffalo, 1892.

On the 4th of April, 1786, the 1st Brigade, 1st Division, was formed in New York city into a brigade of artillery, and was to consist of the 1st and 2d Regts. and a battalion. In April, 1807, the 3d Regt. of New York Artillery was organized of this battalion and other troops. July 27, 1847, the designation of the regiment was changed to the 8th Regt. In December, 1893, it was reduced to a battalion of four companies. It was reorganized as a regiment, Feb. 14, 1896. New companies were organized for the battalion as follows: On July 8, 1895, Co. A; on Oct. 30, 1895, Co. E; on January 27, 1896, Co. H, and on Feb. 14, 1896, Co. G, when it was reorganized as a regiment. April 28, 1898, it was authorized to be organized as a twelve-company regiment to enter the service of the United States. It was in the service of the United States from Sept. 15 to Dec. 15, 1812; from April 23 to Aug. 2, 1861; from May 29 to Sept. 9, 1862; and from June 17 to July 23, 1863. It was mustered in the United States service as the 8th Regt. Infantry, New York Volunteers, May 14, 17 and 19, 1898, and mustered out of such service, Nov. 3, 1898. Cos. L and M were disbanded Dec. 22, 1898. Dec. 10, 1906, Cos. A, C and E were disbanded and the regiment reduced to a battalion of seven companies and designated the 8th



Note.-The National Guard shall not be less than 10,000 nor more than 18,000 enlisted men in time of peace; in case of war, insurrection, invasion, or imminent danger thereof, the Governor has the power to increase the force beyond said 18,000 and organize it as the exigencies of the service may require. The strength of the Naval Militia in time of peace is not to exceed 2,000 men,

but in time of war, invasion, insurrection, or imminent danger thereof, the Governor has power to increase it beyond 2,000 enlisted men and organize it as the exigencies of the service may require.

The following tables show the organization of the several branches of the service, as authorized by the Military Code:




Note.—The staff of the Governor consists of: One Adjutant-General, of the grade of Brigadier-General; one Military Secretary, of grade not above that of Colonel, and sixteen Aides-de-Camp. Four of the Aides-de-Camp may be of such grade as the Governor may desire but not above that of Colonel; the other twelve shall be selected and detailed from the commissioned officers of the National Guard and the Naval Milita in active service of grade below that of Colonel and shall not thereby receive higher rank. The officers thus detailed shall not be relieved from duty with their respective organizations except when actually on duty with the Governor.



Note.—Musicians of a Regiment, Battalion or Squadron when organized into a separate body to be known as "Field Music" will consist of not more han four men for each Company, Troop or Battery part of such organization, one of whom may be appointed Quartermaster-Sergeant, one Sergeant and Corporal.

"Third Battery Light Artillery is allowed six Sergeants and twelve Corporals. "One Second Lieutenant if the company is attached to a regiment or battalion.



## State Pay and Allowances.

#### MILITARY CODE.

§ 151. Duty pay.-Each officer and enlisted man ordered for duty by the governor, or under his authority by the commanding officer of the national guard or the commanding officer of the naval militia, shall receive the duty pay herein specified for every day actually on duty, except when so ordered for inspection, muster or small arms practice, or parade or review or field service not extending beyond one day; a musician or private one dollar and twentyfive cents; a corporal, one dollar and forty cents; an assistant hospital steward, color bearer or a sergeant, one dollar and sixty cents; a first sergeant, guidon sergeant, veterinary sergeant, drum-major, bandmaster, hospital steward, ordnance sergeant, commissary-sergeant, quartermaster-sergeant, sergeant-major, signal sergeant, or a signal sergeant of a squadron of cavalry or battalion of light artillery, two dollars; a first class sergeant of a signal company two dollars and twenty-five cents; a sergeant of a signal company, two dollars; a corporal of a signal company, one dollar and seventy-five cents; a first class private of a signal company, one dollar and fifty cents; a non-commissioned officer performing the duties of a grade higher than his own shall receive the pay of such higher grade; a private acting as a non-commissioned officer shall receive the pay of the grade in which he is acting; each enlisted man who has served a full term of enlistment shall be entitled to additional pay at the rate of twenty-five cents per day during the second five years of his service and a further addition of twenty-five cents per day for each succeeding five years of service; a lieutenant, two dollars and fifty cents; a captain or company commander, three dollars; a major and a lieutenant-colonel, four dollars per day; a colonel or commanding officer of a regiment, or of a battalion or a squadron not part of a regiment, five dollars; a brigadier-general, six dollars; a major-general, eight dollars; staff officers, the pay of officers of the line of equal grade; chaplains, the pay of captains. Officers and men of the naval militia shall be paid according to their assimilated grade with those of the land forces herein set forth. When on duty or assembled therefor, in case of riot, tumult, breach of the peace, insurrection. invasion or war, or whenever called in aid of the civil authorities, commissioned officers shall be entitled to and shall receive the same pay and allowances as commissioned officers of the army or navy of the United States of equal grade and term of service as the case may be. Each officer and enlisted man, mounted and equipped, shall be paid a reasonable compensation per day for each horse actually used by him.

§ 152. Pay when aiding the civil authority.—All officers and enlisted men while on duty, or assembled therefor, pursuant to the orders of a judge of the supreme court, sheriff of a county or mayor of a city, or any other civil officer authorized by law to make such a demand on the military or naval forces of the State, in case of riot, tumult, breach of the peace, resistance to process, or whenever called upon in aid of civil authorities, shall receive the pay set forth in sec-

tion one hundred and fifty-one of this chapter; and such compensation and the necessary expenses incurred in quartering, caring for, warning for duty and transporting and subsisting the troops, as well as the expense incurred for pay, care and subsistence of officers and enlisted men temporarily disabled in the line of duty, while on such duty, as set forth in section one hundred and sixty-five of this chapter shall be paid by the county where such service is rendered. The county treasurer of such county shall, upon presentation to him of vouchers and pay rolls for such expenses and compensation, certified by the commanding officers of the organizations on duty in aid of civil authority in such county or counties, and approved by the commanding officer of the national guard, if he be present in command where the duty is performed, or by the commanding officer of the brigade or of the naval militia to which the organizations were attached, forthwith execute in behalf of and in the name of such county, a certificate or certificates of indebtedness for the money required to pay such vouchers and pay rolls; such certificates shall bear interest at the rate of not to exceed six per centum per annum, and shall be made payable on the first day of February following the expiration of two months from their issue, and the amount thereof shall be raised in the next tax budget of said county succeeding their issue, and applied to the payment of such certificates. Said county treasurer shall sell such certificates at public or private sale, and apply the proceeds thereof to the payment of such expenses and compensation. In the city of New York the duties hereby imposed upon a county treasurer shall be performed by the comptroller of said city, who shall raise the money necessary to comply with the provisions of this section by the issue and sale of revenue bonds of said city; the sum necessary to pay said bonds shall be included by the municipal assembly and board of estimate and apportionment of said city in its final estimates for expenses of said city for the year succeeding that in which said bonds were issued. Any county treasurer or public officer, who shall neglect or refuse to perform any of the duties required by this section, shall be personally charged with the cost and all necessary disbursements of any action or proceeding brought to compel such performance, together with a reasonable additional allowance to the plaintiff or relator in such action or proceeding, to be fixed by the court.

§ 156. Allowances for officers.—Commissioned officers shall receive annually the sum of thirty dollars, mounted officers the sum of fifty dollars, to assist in uniforming and equipping themselves, but not until they have performed eighty per centum of all ordered duty and been in active service as such a calendar year of twelve months, beginning with the first day of January.

## Pensions and Disability Pay.

#### MILITARY CODE.

§ 162. Pensions.—Every member of the militia who shall be wounded or disabled while in the service of the State, in cases of riot, tumult, breach of the peace, resistance to process, invasion, insurrection, or imminent danger thereof, or whenever called upon in aid of the civil authorities, shall be taken care of and provided for at the expense of the State, and every such member who shall be wounded or disabled, or has been so disabled in the performance of any actual service of this State, within ten years preceding the application for a pension under this act, in case of riots, tumults, breach of the peace, resistance to process, invasion, insurrection or imminent danger thereof, or whenever called upon in aid of the civil authorities, or while engaged in any lawfully ordered parade, drill, encampment or inspection, shall upon proof of the fact, as hereinafter provided, be placed on the roll of invalid pensioners of the State, and shall receive, out of any moneys in the treasury of the State, not otherwise appropriated, upon the audit of the adjutant-general and approval of the governor, the like pension or reward that persons under similar circumstances receive from the United States, and in case of any wound, injury or disease causing death, then the widow or minor children of such member of the militia shall receive such pension and reward, from the time of receiving the injuries on account of which such pension or reward No officer or enlisted man shall be entitled, while in active service, to is allowed. make application for a pension.

§ 165. Pay and care when injured or disabled in service.—A member of the national guard or naval militia who shall, when on duty or assembled therefor, in case of riot, tumult, breach of the peace, insurrection or invasion, or whenever ordered by the governor, commanding officer of the national guard, or the commanding officer of the naval militia, or called in aid of the civil authorities, receive any injury, or incur or contract any disability or disease, by reason of such duty or assembly therefor, or who shall without fault or neglect on his part be wounded or disabled while performing any lawfully ordered duty, which shall temporarily incapacitate him from pursuing his usual business or occupation, shall during the period of such incapacity, receive the pay provided by this chapter and actual necessary expenses for care and medical attendance. Under this chapter no disability shall be considered temporary which continue for more than ninety days from the date of receiving the injury or of incuring or contracting the disease or disability, and pay and expenses for care and medical attendance for more than the said ninety days shall not be allowed. All claims arising under this section shall be inquired into by a medical examiner or by a board of three officers, at least one being a medical officer, to be appointed by the adjutantgeneral, upon the application of the member claiming to be so incapacitated. Such medical examiner or board shall have the same power to take evidence, administer oaths, issue subpœnas and compel witnesses to attend and testify and produce books and papers, and punish their failure to do so, as is possessed by a


general court martial. The findings of the medical examiner or board shall be subject to the approval of the adjutant-general, who may return the proceedings of the medical examiner or board for revision and for taking further testimony. The amount found due such member by said medical examiner or board to the extent that the findings are approved by the adjutant-general, shall be a charge against and be paid in the manner provided by this chapter, by the county in which such duty was rendered, in every case where a county is by this chapter made liable to pay for the performance of military duty. In all other cases such sums shall be paid by this State in like manner as other military accounts are paid.

## Prohibiting Discrimination Against Members of the National Guard.

#### PENAL CODE.

§ 171b. A person, who, either by himself or with another, wilfully deprives a member of the national guard of his employment, or prevents his being employed by himself or another, or obstructs or annoys said member of said national guard, or his employer, in respect of his trade, business, or employment, because said member of said national guard is such member, or dissuades any person from enlistment in the said national guard by threat of injury to him in case he shall so enlist in respect of his employment, trade, or business, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
§ 171c. No association or corporation, constituted or organized for the pur-

§ 171c. No association or corporation, constituted or organisms of the mempose of promoting the success of the trade, employment, or business of the members thereof, shall by any constitution, rule, by-law, resolution, vote, or regulation, discriminate against any member of the national guard of the State of New York because of such membership in respect of the eligibility of such member of the said national guard to membership in such association or corporation, or in respect of his right to retain said last mentioned membership; it being the purpose of this section and the section immediately preceding to protect a member of the said national guard from disadvantage in his means of livelihood and liberty therein but not to give him any preference or advantage on account of his membership of said national guard. A person who aids in enforcing any [such provision against a member of the said national guard with the intent to discriminate against him because of such membership, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
